At the Aug. 28th meeting, Barbara Lane of the Mid-Shore Community Foundation spoke to the Club. The

Mid-Shore Community Foundation (MSCF) helps non-profit organizations, individuals, families, businesses and helps meet community needs.

Community foundations are stewards of philanthropy and connect private resources with the public needs. The MSCF puts the money it receives into a savings account which lets the money grow so that there will be sufficient funds to cover the needs. MSCF is one of 750 community foundations in the USA. Combined the community foundations have 44 billion dollars in assets.

The MSCF was an offshoot of the United Way Fund of Talbot County and started in 1992. It is defined by the geographic regions of Dorchester, Talbot, Caroline, Queen Anne and Kent Counties.

Through the MSCF benefactors get the maximum benefit of their philanthropy. By pooling their money, a large sum is generated which better meets the needs. All the administrative aspects of one's philanthropy is

met by the Fund and the MSCF provides quarterly reports, oversight of investments, audit and tax filings as well as site visits and evaluations of prospective grantees.

All donations and gifts to the MSCF are fully tax deductible. Some organizations, which do not have a tax-free status, are helped by the MSCF because they are able to be under the Fund's tax-free status umbrella.

The MSCF is the guardian of all the funds that come to them. Each year the grant recipients change and there are no fixed grants.

In 2008 there are 190 funds in the MSCF and 418 grants totaling \$1,312, 199 have been issued.

At the Aug. 28th meeting, 44 of our 67 active members attended. With no known make-ups our attendance was 66%.
