## American Cancer Society

Mary Bellis, from the American Cancer Society, brought the members up to date concerning the programs and patient services that are offered by the Cancer Society. She first complimented Pocomoke City on the fundraising effort by the Relay for Life during recent years. One of the services she mentioned was the Road to Recovery in which volunteers are recruited to drive cancer patients to chemotherapy, radiation, surgery or initial appointments. Another is the dietitian on call in which the patient can call a central number and receive information from a registered dietitian. A Man to Man program sets up groups in which men with prostate cancer can meet with other victims and hear discussions about the problems. College scholarships are offered to teens that have been diagnosed with cancer. Hope Lodge provides free housing for cancer patients and their caregivers when they are undergoing treatment at a cancer center. To be eligible they must live 100 miles from the center. The society even provides wigs free of charge for survivors who request them.
